Staff Reporting Responsibilities During an Announced Delayed School Opening



All school staff are responsible and obligated to report to work as early as possible, but not later than the later starting time on a day with an authorized two hour delayed opening. For our school, this would be 10:00 am. Regular attendance reporting standards apply (absences, latenesses) based on this later starting time.

These regular standards include the principal's discretion in approving or denying extraordinary Transportation Delay Forms for staff (OP201) contingent upon, as applicable, confirmation of delays by the Transit Authority, Department of Transportation or other agencies involved with the specific cause of delay (again, based on the later starting time).

AP Examination Information

The Importance of AP

According to the College Board, "AP is accepted by more than 3,600 colleges and universities worldwide for college credit, advanced placement, or both on the basis of successful AP Exam grades" (AP Program Guide 2008-09 3). The opportunity for students to earn college credits is fast approaching. Be sure to meet the deadlines below for AP Exam registration:

Meeting Deadlines

The deadline to register and pay for your AP exams is Tue., Mar. 22. If you are paying by check or money order, bring your envelope to Ms. Fogel in Room 237. If you wish to pay online, visit LaProgram.org. **NO LATE REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED!**

Receiving Log-in Information

To be able to register, every student registered for at least one AP class will receive their username and password for Daedalus. You may have received this information before. If that is the case and you have already changed your password, use the last password you had. Your teacher will go over the registration process during class.

Each student will receive their log-in information only one time. Students with more than one AP class will receive their letter from only one of their AP teachers. Therefore, there may be some students for which teachers do not have log-in information. These students should have received it through another class.

Extended Time and Absence

- Please make sure to see Ms. van Keulen in Room 261 if any one of the following is true: you think the College Office approved you for extended time or special accommodations, you have two examinations at the same time, or you cannot take a test because of a funeral, graduation of a sibling, or other excused absence.
- If you are absent for an AP exam and you wish to take the late administration, you must present a note from a medical professional to excuse your absence. The College Board grants LaGuardia High School the right to decide whether or not a late AP exam will be administered.
- If you are unsure of your College Board extended time status, please see Ms. van Keulen in 261 ASAP. If you already know you are approved for extended time by the College Board, also see Ms. van Keulen ASAP.

How to Register for AP Examinations

To register for the AP Exams, please follow the steps below.

1. Go to the following URL: LaProgram.org. There you will find a link to <https://students-laguardiahs.theschoolsystem.net/login.rb>
2. Login using the complete username (including the "@laguardiahs.net") and the password provided.
3. Go to "Register for A.P. Exams"
4. Use the scroll-down menu to select the exam(s) you wish to take. **DO NOT REGISTER FOR ANY EXAMS YOU HAVE NO INTENTION OF ACTUALLY TAKING.**
5. After you have selected all of the exams you wish to take, click "Update."
6. You will be sent to a page that will give you the calculation of your amount due for payment. Please print this form and put it in an envelope with a check or money order, made out to LaGuardia High School, if applicable. **NO CASH WILL BE ACCEPTED.** Bring this envelope to Ms. Fogel in Room 237. Alternatively, you may pay your fees online at the LaGuardia web store. 7. The full fee for each AP exam is \$86. Students who qualify for the Federal Free Lunch subsidy pay no fee. If you believe that you should not pay or you should pay a reduced fee, please see Ms. Fogel in Room 237.
8. The Parents Association offers financial aid to those students who do not qualify for free lunch but feel that they need financial assistance to pay for these exams. See Ms. Fogel in Room 237 to receive an application.
9. Applications and checks are due on or before Tue., Mar. 22.
10. If you have any problems registering, please see Mrs. Wilson in Room 261.
