#### **STUDENTS** Exam Invitations

On June 4th , during OP, we will distribute Exam Invitations. (Currently the DOE requires us to program in STARS all students taking the Regents, LOTE, and Studio Comprehensive.) No student will be taken out of an examination section if the student is part of a class/cohort culminating in an exam . If a student is absent from an exam, the ABS will stay on the student's transcript.

#### **Regents Registration**

Any student who is not in a Regents terminating class but does need to take the Regents should see a guidance counselor before Wednesday, June 5, to register. Any student who does not register cannot take the exam.

#### TEACHERS Attendance Records

Any attendance record must be cleared before the last day of school. After that, no attendance record can be changed for the school year.

# Programming Letter in Daedalus, we will do our best to accommodate

Dear Student,

On May 23, 2013 you received your tentative list of classes that you have been approved to take for the next school year.

If you selected classes in Daedalus (i.e., electives in visual arts, AP and honors classes, and electives in science and world language) and some of the classes you selected are not on the list you received, follow the steps explained below. Some classes were assigned to you automatically.

AP and Honors: If you added your name to a wait list for AP and/or honors classes and were not accepted into one of these classes, please speak to the appropriate department chair and your current teacher.

Science for sophomores and juniors: If you did not choose any science course in Daedalus, you were placed in the most appropriate level of science based on your transcript. All sophomores and juniors must have a science class.

Mathematics: Classes were assigned automatically based on student transcripts. For AP courses in Mathematics and Calculus, see the bullet regarding AP and Honors.

English for Seniors: If you made no selection, you were placed in Film Literature. If you would like to change to another senior English class, you may apply in Daedalus by Thursday, May 30th. (See instructions in the Yellow Sheet.) At this time most of the classes are full, but if you chose another class in Daedalus, we will do our best to accommodate your request.

Arts Electives: Some classes will not exist due to low enrollment. In these cases, you were given your second choice; please see your guidance counselor if you have any questions. If you did not choose classes in Daedalus, you were given classes automatically based on availability. At this time most of the classes are full, but if you choose another class

your request.

Music Electives: If you were accepted for an additional ensemble (your fourth music class), and you do not have it on the list, you may request to be placed in the class in September.

Eleven period day: We cannot accommodate eleven periods. If the Request for Classes shows the code ZQ11P, you must see Ms. van Keulen to indicate which class you would like to drop to ensure you have a ten-period day. The deadline for this process is Thursday, May 30th. If you make no choice, the Program Office will choose for you. Please note that AP Art Portfolio (code ALS21XQN) meets after school and it should not be counted as an 11th period.

Drama and Technical Theater: All drama and tech students will take Physical Education. (For 10th and 11th grade drama students, this class is offered within the drama block.) Drama and tech seniors will take Physical Education as well as Health in the first semester of their school year.

Please go to your guidance counselor with the following issues:

You would like to drop an honors or an AP . class.

You would like to select another science class that is not an AP level class.

You are in an off-track world language (\*).

You are a senior and would like a math and/ • or a science class that is not an AP class.

You have on your list of classes for next year a class that you have already passed.

Please see your guidance counselor during your lunch or your free period on: May 28 – Juniors, May 29 – Sophomores, May 30 - Freshmen. Sincerely,

# Requesting Changes on Daedalus

You may make adjustments to your course request listing by logging in to Daedalus after you have followed the steps explained in the letter above, such as seeing a department AP, a guidance counselor, or Ms. van Keulen.

## NOTE: Do not submit new requests on Daedalus if you are satisfied with your classes. Ask for a change <u>only</u> in the subject with which you have an issue.

Step One: Log in to Daedalus, which you can access by clicking on the link on LaProgram.org. Click on "Indicate/View Your Preferences/Courses for Next Term." (Do not be confused by this Daedalus-specific link.) Step Two: Select courses you would like to add and drop, and click on "Submit."

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
